After School Activity Buses run on Mondays and Wednesdays. These buses are only for those students who have been approved to ride a DPS bus for the day school hours in the mornings and/or afternoons. There are 4 buses that depart from Morey at 4:30 and drops offs are in the four quadrants of the city. Staff will assist students in catching the correct bus. All other days, transportation must be provided by the parent and students are required to leave the school grounds by 4:30 if they are enrolled in an after school activity.

DESCRIPTIONS/REQUIREMENTS

Homework Help – Come and complete homework assignments, check out books, and use the computer lab to complete assignments. Students who attend must have homework assignments in order to participate. If you need Math assistance, please report to the Math Tutoring Rooms listed on the schedule. Staff members are also on hand to teach student organizational skills. We have found this especially helpful for 6th grade students.

Board Games – Come and choose a new board game or a favorite old one and compete with your peers!

Card Sharks – Come and learn some fascinating card games, from easy to difficult.

Creative Writing-Learn writing skills while at the same time have fun creating poetry, short stories and more! This is taught by a certified teacher. She has some great, interactive and fun projects.

Girls Drop In Volleyball – drop in and have fun. Learn some new skills and enjoy the sport. ***It begins the first week in February.***

Theatre Club – Put on a theatre presentation. Tryouts for the club will be in room 207. Student directors, actors, stage set people will be needed. A performance for the Morey community will take place in the fall and a musical in the spring. In order to present a great production, students must be consistent in their attendance for Mondays and Wednesdays.

Art Club – This year, students will create sculptures from various mediums, including wood, plaster, etc.

Geography Bee-Learn some geography facts and compete with other schools in the district.

Environmental Club – learn the latest in environmental education AND do some great FUN community projects at Morey.

Semantics – learn some great spelling skills and compete with other schools. Become a champion! This activity is available through the competitions in the spring.

***Computer Club** – This activity is sponsored by Morey Neighborhood Center. Come find out how much fun you can have on the computer! You will learn how to make movies, create music tracks, create cartoon animations, and create and edit photos.

Yearbook – Be a part of creating the Morey Middle School Yearbook! Students ***must commit*** to the club through it's creation (March).

Math Tutoring – Having trouble understanding your math? Get some extra help. You can “drop in” for some help OR attend weekly for more enrichment and tutoring.

Swimming – Drop in and swim and enjoy our pool. To participate, all students MUST have their swim physical on file at Morey. This is limited to 25 students. Be sure and bring your appropriate bathing suit and your own towel. Towels from the PE Dept. are not to be used for this.

Jazz Club – **Students who enroll in this activity must be intermediate or advanced players.** Come and learn new music and be a part of our jazz ensemble team. Students will perform at various activities and events.

Film Club – come and view movies with specific themes. All movies will be G or PG unless otherwise notified by the teacher. Study their themes; how they influence our society and critique the writers and actors...maybe learn some acting clues along the way! This activity ends at 4:30.

Colorado Ballet Company –In this 10 week class, students will learn beginning contemporary/modern dance as well as beginning components of dance making. The end product will be a dance specific to the students' interpretation of contemporary dance and choreography. All students will get to create an element of the dance using what they have learned in the class. Please dress comfortably and be ready to move! **This will begin in February.**

Sign Language-learn sign language from a teacher who is certified to teach it. There is a growing need for sign language interpreters and it will be presented in a fun, learning environment.

Girls Club- Come and have fun, learn new things and get to know your peers! We will be going to visit the Colorado Ballet, Art Museum and have some great fun here at Morey with other “girlfriends”.

Chess Club- Beginner? Advanced? This is for YOU! Learn the game, teach others the game and compete for prizes!

Board Games-come and play your favorite board games with your peers. A lot of new games will be available.

Student Council-see Ms. Tricia Huth (Room 104 and 105) for details and recommendation to be on Student Council.

Boys Drop-In Sports-This is sponsored by the MNC. Come and drop in and shoot some hoops, throw a football and have fun!

Rock Climbing-Eight weeks of rock climbing adventure! You will play climbing games, learn the sport and then experience it at the Lakewood Links Climbing Center at the end of the course. If you enjoy this activity, you can come and check out CityWILD'S full after school program that goes whitewater rafting, snowboarding and mountain biking! **BEGINS JANUARY 6TH 2010.**

For after school activities, we request a \$100.00 fee for the year. This may be paid in two installments or, if finances are a challenge, we can make other arrangements. ALL students must have a registration form on file. The forms are available in Room 102. Students must stay in their activity until 4:00 pm (or later if the club is listed longer than 4:00 pm) unless otherwise notified by a parent. Students may not leave Morey and then return for an activity. All students MUST be in their activity by 3:00. Students who are not supervised by an adult after school but are consistently "loitering" subject themselves to possible ticketing by the Denver Police Department.
